Dropouts Pose Major Problem For Educators

One of the tragic needless human wastes of our time is the thousands of young people who are dropping out of school. It affects all of us for these young unskilled and unemployed people depress the labor market.

"They, one of the leading social problems in the U. S. is the students who quit school before the 12th grade," according to Dr. Carole Hammond of the University of Kentucky. "Because of the dropout rate, two-thirds of the unemployed men and women have less than a high school education."

BY 1970 NOT more than five percent of the jobs will be for the unskilled.

A recent survey in the Appalachian States of Tennessee and Kentucky estimates that only 22 of any 100 first-graders in the area are likely to finish high school.

Save the Children Federation of Norwalk, Connecticut, which has been active in the Southern Mountain States, is facing the challenge of school dropouts last year. The Federation introduced a unique program, a combination of scholarship and self-help principle, based on the self-help principle which motivates its sponsorship and family and community development.

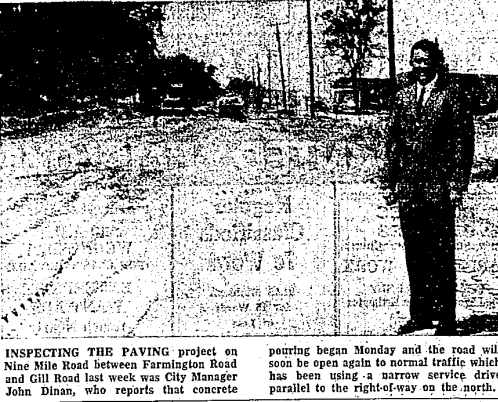
THE BIG SOLID factors accounting for most dropouts are:
