Christmas is for children. Their enthusiasm and excitement make it fun for us adults. To do something for a child that in some way is not as fortunate as your own offspring can give you a special feeling of warmth.
The Women of Kendallwood Farms chose to make their "special" Christmas offering to the Plymouth State Home and Training School, for severely retarded children. We have supported this charity for the past five years. The funds for our Christmas present to these children does not come from the treasury, it is contributed by the individual members.
FOR SEVERAL years, at the November meeting, we have asked the members for their gifts. At our meeting before Thanksgiving, Gale Girolami, Hospital Coordinator, spoke to us briefly about the hospital, its background, its purpose and our relationship to the home. This resume was of special interest to our many new members who may not be too familiar with our charity. This year's free will offering brought our members and thank them for their generosity.
With this sum of money, Gale was able to purchase for the blind, a "Castle Tower" which consists of 46 children. One is an outdoor jungle gym type apparatus. The other is a 26-piece rhythm band such as is used in our kindergarten and early elementary grades. Choice of any such gifts is based on the advice of the hospital in accord with the amount of money available.
Both of these gifts will be used in education and therapy for these children. The purpose of the Plymouth State Home and Training School is to attain the maximum potential of each patient through physical therapy, special education and recreation programs, regardless of the degree of physical handicap and or mental re-
