THIS RESULTED in some further lengthy discussion on whether there was really a need or purpose for holding a hearing before the Planning Commission. Some felt there was and others that there was not.

It also prompted the mayor to request that a legal opinion be given by the City attorney on what legal problems or complications could result if the Council decided to make a decision on the basis of the Planning Commission's recommendation without holding a hearing itself.

The recent resignation of Howard Tupper from the City of Farmington, Commission, and Zoning Board of Appeals due to ill health has left the Zoning Board of Appeals without a representative on it from the Planning Commission.

The appointment of a planner to the Zoning Appeals Board came up for discussion at the regular City Council meeting Monday night with the decision being to delay such appointment until the planners can discuss the matter themselves and recommend an appointee.

A Council decision will then be delayed until the January 20 meeting.

### 3000 All City to Give To Clear Parking Lot

The City Council took the position Monday night that it should spend no more than \$3000 to clear the City parking lot in the southeast quadrant of the downtown business section cleared of snow by a private contractor. The request for a higher contribution from a spokesman for the Farmington Center Corp. was therefore denied.

Major users of this parking area are customers of the tenants in the Farmington Center Corp. stores even though it is a covered parking lot. Since the Center Corp. wanted the lot cleaned out of snow faster than City DPW crews could get to the job, it was agreed last year that the City share the cost up to \$3000 annually to have the work done privately.
