Clarenceville School News

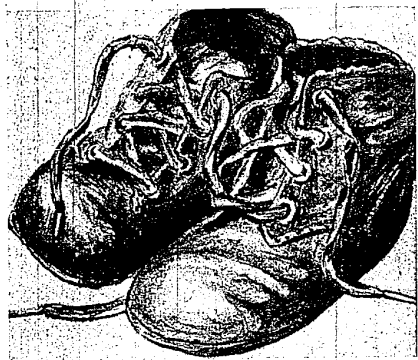

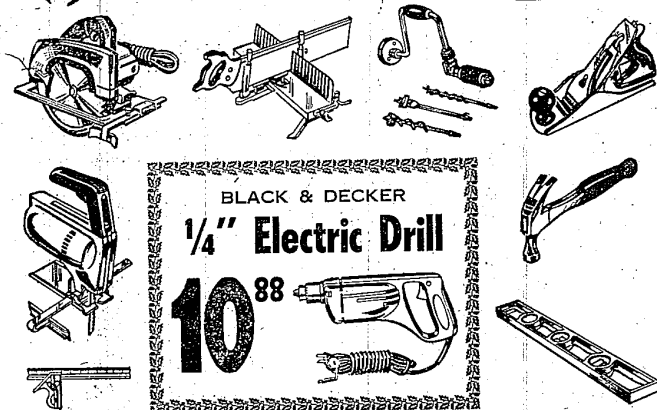

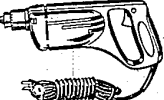
