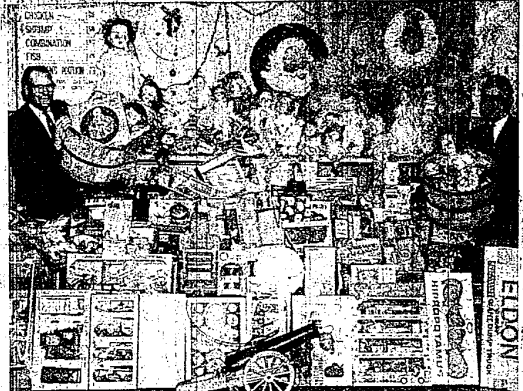

High School Grad
 Farmington High School awarded diplomas to 397 graduating seniors. A total of 83 graduates from Our Lady of Sorrows High School.
Floyd Jaye Resigns
 Farmington Township Board Trustee Floyd Jaye resigned his post due to a necessity to move out of the community.
Nazi Leader Boos
 The appearance of George Lincoln Rockwell in Farmington proved to be brief and almost uneventful. The self-proclaimed leader of the American Nazi Party was booed and shouted down a few minutes after he opened an outdoor speaking engagement here.
School Election
 Mrs. Barbara Brown was re-elected to the Farmington School District Board of Education in the June 10 School Election.
New Twp. Bd. Trustee
 Byron Walker, who won election April 1 to the Township Board Trustee post vacated by Ray Wilcox, was sworn into office. Walker was the only successful newcomer voted into office in the Township.
May
 Russ Gilbert of the Town and Country Dodge automobile agency was elected President of the newly organized Farmington Board of Commerce.
YMCA Campaign
 Dick Habicht, owner of White House Valet laundry in Farmington, was named to head the 1963 YMCA enrollment campaign in the community.
Spencer J. Heeney Dies
 Spencer J. Heeney, a funeral director in Farmington for 41 years, died suddenly. He was the third prominent Farmington businessman to pass away from the community since the first of the year. Long-time area druggist Mahlon Bradley and local oil dealer Fred Curcio passed away earlier in the year.
Eliminate Steps
 The City Council received plans for changing the elevations of Grand River Avenue in the Downtown Farmington business district which would eliminate all but one step along the north side of the main thoroughfare and along the south-west corner of the Grand River and Farmington Road intersection.
Historical Marker
 An Historical Marker was dedicated on the grounds of the Botsford Inn at a tri-county observance at a Farmington Michigan Week. The popular Farmington Township establishment is 127 years old and the 24th historic site to be dedicated in the state of Michigan.
Mayor Re-Elected
 Farmington Mayor Robert Lindbert was unanimously re-elected by fellow City Councilmen to serve another two-year term.
June
 Widen Orchard Lk. Rd.
 The Oakland County Road Commission announced the widening of Orchard Lake Road, at its intersection with Grand River, would be completed and a stop and go traffic signal installed by the end of June.
Board of Commerce
 The first general meeting of the Farmington Board of Commerce was held at the Delta County Farmers in Michigan's Upper Peninsula have set state and national field records for the growth of non-irrigated potatoes, more than 1,040 bushels an acre.
