Village Woman's Club Plans Spring Series

Once again the Village Woman's Club, 195 East Long Lake Road, Bloomfield Hills is offering a stimulating series of classes for the spring season, geared to their live and want to enrich their lives.

Headline the spring semester will be three new courses: History in the Making, Art and a night course in Spanish. Last autumn's popular courses in Antiques, Japanese Flower Arrangement, Bridge, French and Spanish will continue.

THE HISTORY IN THE MAKING series presented in conjunction with the Division of Continuing Education of Oakland University will open its eighth series at 9:30 a.m. on January 16 when Dr. David C. Potter will discuss the relationship of India's history to contemporary events.

Dr. Potter, recently appointed assistant professor of political science at Oakland University, came from the University of London School of Economics and Science where he received his Ph.D. in 1959-60. He was a recipient of a Fulbright fellowship. During his graduate studies he spent nearly two years in India, where his field was public law, government and public administration. Dr. Potter received his M.A. and B.A. from the University of California.

Another lecturer in the History in the Making series will be Dr. Alfred G. Meyer, a specialist on the Soviet Union, who is a professor of political science at Michigan State University. Additional speakers will be announced later.

THE CLUB is fortunate to obtain Adela Gonzalez (Mrs. Charles) as instructor for its new night course in Spanish which begins at 8 p.m. on January 16.

Mrs. Renfrew was born in Durban, Natal, South Africa, where she received her B.S. She earned her M.A. from Wayne State University in Foreign Language Education. Currently she is a teacher and consultant for the Royal Oak Public Schools. She was married in 1962 to James Renfrew, an attorney and former judge in Huntington Woods. Mrs. Renfrew received her U.S. Citizenship in 1963. A woman of many interests, she has traveled in Mexico, Central America and Cuba, sings folk songs to her own guitar accompaniment and is working on her own ham radio license.

Beginning March 21 and continuing weekly for eight weeks, Dr. Ernst Scheyer, Professor of Art History and Humanities, at Wayne State University, will lecture on Art. Dr. Scheyer is well known in this area, having taught at Cranbrook Academy of Arts during the period when Charles Dames, Harry Bertola, Eliel and Bero Saarinen and the Carl Milles were associated there.

CLASSES IN THE CREATIVE and meaningful art of Japanese flower arranging are scheduled for six weeks beginning January 14. The instructor, Mrs. Lawson M. McKenzie, has studied with Mrs. Frank A. Allen, the founder of Ikebana International, a society formed for those interested in Ikebana, the art of Japanese flower arrangement, and Madame Joze Oshikawa, head of the International Flower Arrangement School in Tokyo. She has demonstrated the art on television and has helped arrange exhibits for flower shows and garden clubs.

The Antique Series will begin on March 2, with Mr. Gerald Gibson speaking on "Early American Fabrics and Interior Decorations". Mr. Gibson is Curator of Decorative Art at the Henry Ford Museum.
