

Bd. Canvassers Appointed by C'ville Sch. Bd.

The new State Constitution provides for certain new procedures in elections. The major change has been the requiring of a Board of Canvassers.

The Board of Canvassers has a responsibility to canvass the election, check the reports of the Election Inspectors, and provide the Board of Education with certificates stating the results of the election.

AT A SPECIAL meeting of the Board of Education held January 7, 1964, the Board of Canvassers was appointed, consisting of the following people whose terms will expire December 31, 1965 — Norman L. Hunt and Daniel J. Shay; and Elbert M. Harmon and William G. Lawrence, whose terms will expire December 31, 1967.

This Board of Canvassers met in their first meeting January 9, 1964 and elected Elbert M. Harmon as Chairman and Daniel J. Shay as Vice-Chairman.

They certified the election to the Board of Education as correct, and also informed the Board of Education that the proposition had been approved by the electorate.

Go-Ahead Given on Bldg. Plans By C'ville Bd. of Education

At a special election held in the Clarendonville School District January 7, the voters approved a \$750,000 bond issue by a vote of 539 to 198. Although the total percentage of registration was not very high, the largest east in a Clarendonville School election since June 11, 1962.

The Board of Education had previously authorized the architect to proceed with the preliminary drawings for the Edgewood Elementary School, said drawings to be presented to the Board of Education on January 23.

AT A SPECIAL meeting of the Board of Education held January 7, authorization was given to the architect to proceed with the preliminary drawings for the swimming pool addition to the Senior High School. At this same meeting authorization was given to the administration and the school attorney to proceed with the necessary steps to provide for the sale of the bonds. Before the sale can be made, the administration and attorney must prepare the necessary application and the Board of Education must approve, by resolution, the presentation of this to the Municipal Finance Commission.

At this early date it is not possible to predict a definite time when construction will start. It is hoped that work can begin at least by the coming summer.

Consumers Power Co. Plans Expansion Program

Consumers Power Company announced this week that it will system in downtown Grand Rapids will require an investment of more than \$500,000.

Communities to which natural gas service will be extended during 1964 are Ashley, Augusta, Au Gres, Bad Axe, Britton, Buck Lake, Burnips, Byron, Ceresco, Columbusville, Elkton, Falmouth, Fowler, Gagetown, Gaines, Hamburg, Harbor Beach, Lennon, Lyons, Marcellus, Mayville, McMillan, North Star, Otter, Otseville, Owendale, Pewamo, Pigeon, Pinckney, Portage Lake, Remus, Rush Lake, Sanford, Sterling, Uby, Westphalia and Zeeland.

CONSUMERS expects to add 27,700 gas customers and 14,000 electric customers in 1964. In 1963 it added 31,000 gas customers and 13,000 electric customers, bringing the present total of customers to 912,000 electric and 615,000 gas.

Natural gas projects will cost \$33 million and electric projects \$27 million. About \$5 million will be spent for additional office and warehouse facilities, land and rights of way, steam-heating improvements and miscellaneous purposes.

Expansion of the company's natural gas system will involve expenditures of \$20,500,000 for gas distribution system projects and \$4,000,000 for compressor capacity and other gas extension facilities. It will include extension of natural gas service to 37 additional communities, more than ever before connected in a single year.

Electric distribution system additions and improvements in many parts of the Lower Peninsula will involve expenditures of about \$18 million. Transmission system projects to fortify power supply in several areas are estimated at \$2,300,000.

MIL. AYMOND and Mr. Campbell said power plant construction in recent years have brought the company's electric generating capacity to 2,800,000 kilowatts, about twice what it was in 1953. Many improvements in existing power plants are scheduled for 1964. Land and rights of way will be acquired for future extra high voltage transmission lines and substations.
