- That the Township Board of the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, has duly and lawfully declared its intention to make the following improvement: Construction of sanitary sewers to be located in the Township as follows:
 - Walsingham Drive from Lot 15 of Heather Hills Sub. No. 2 to Lot 57 of Heather Hills Sub. No. 2.
 - Walsingham Drive from Castlemeadow Drive to Lot 65 of Heather Hills Sub. No. 2.
