SELLING TICKETS to the dance which will feature the music of the Vikings and refreshments has presented a challenge to many of Officer Butters' fellow policemen.

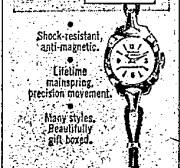

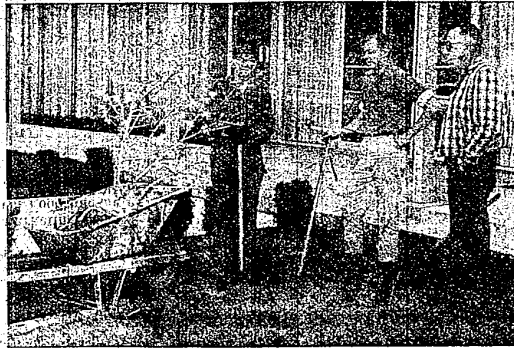

Vehicle Safety-Check

(Continued from Page 1A) Farmington to give motorists an opportunity to take advantage of the free and voluntary Vehicle Safety-Check. The lanes will be open throughout the day and will be operated by Service Managers from Farmington Car Dealerships and qualified mechanics.

Vehicle safety check program, applied the efforts of local service clubs and organizations who have joined in to support the two-day safety-check program.

Among the groups who are cooperating to sponsor the vehicle safety-check program are the Farmington Board of Commerce, the Junior Chamber of Commerce and the Optimist Club. Farmington Boy Scouts also take part in the program.

Local car dealers who are contributing the qualified personnel to man the check lanes.

THE SAFETY-CHECK in Farmington is part of the annual National Vehicle Safety-Check for Communities sponsored by Auto Industries Highway Safety Committee and LOOK Magazine, with the cooperation of the Association of State and Provincial Safety Coordinators.

Last year, Safety-Checkers conducted 3,000 examinations, counties, military installations, industrial plants, governmental agencies, youth groups, new car and the dealers and other organizations.

Two homeowners on Lakeway present at the meeting concurred with the city manager. They pointed out that they were still concerned about one phase of the store's operations which is proving to be an annoyance to them, namely the operations of the public address system.

THE HOMEOWNERS said that they were satisfied with the lighting changes that had been worked out with the store's management by the city manager.

The large store sign at the front of the building is now being turned off at 10 o'clock in the evening instead of being left on until one or two o'clock in the morning. Lights in the outdoor evergreen and shrub area are being turned off at 9 p.m. and most of the lights inside the store are also being turned off after closing hours, Dinan disclosed in his report.

Ivan B. Clarke whose home is some 800 feet away from the store, stated that he and his family are still able to hear the public address system very clearly and it is an annoyance to them. A next-door neighbor concurred with him on this.

THE COUNCIL instructed Dinan to meet with store officials again to see if some different system and lighting lights, phones or a much lower volume public address system couldn't be utilized to summon them from various parts of the building.

The city manager and also the two Lakeway homeowners expressed satisfaction with the cooperation that the Frank's store management has shown to far on this matter.

The city council took action Monday night approving the request of the two business firms to locate the music trailer in the small city parking lot next to their stores and to offer live organ music from it during regular business hours.

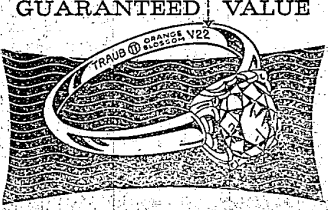

(Continued from Page 1-A) signal but later said he was not sure. He had stopped just prior to the accident at a gas station on the corner of Northwestern Highway and Middlebelt to telephone the State Police and ask for an escort home because he thought his gas tank was leaking and didn't think he could make it home. He told the State Police he wanted the escort home so that "I am not stopped by a sheriff police car before I run out of gas."

BRANT'S CAR ended up 106 feet from the point of impact, in the ditch south of 13 Mile Road on the east side of Middlebelt Road. Miss Fox's car ended up 55 feet from the crash point, in the ditch at the south-east corner of the intersection.

The fatal accident was the fourth recorded in Farmington Township this year. Farmington Township's third traffic fatality occurred just one week earlier and just one mile further down Middlebelt at the 12 Mile Road intersection.
