**Garden Lights Can Add Beauty**

Lighting gardens at night is an excellent means of enjoying the home grounds and extending the period of outdoor living. In the past, much of the lighting has been used to emphasize the architecture in the landscape at the expense of the plant materials.

Lighting the plants of a garden is rapidly gaining popularity and many types of equipment are available for outdoor use.

**THE EFFECT** of artificial light on flowers, trees, and shrubs is a spectacle that any homeowner will be proud of and can have at very low cost. Experiments have indicated that night lighting improves the appearance of plants and garden when using colors that harmonize with the foliage. It was also found that plants exposed to additional illumination of both green, red, white, and yellow lights increased in growth, and with many plants, increasing flowering.

A bulletin on lighting for home gardens published by Michigan State University is available at no charge from your County Extension Office from the Bulletin Office, Michigan State University, at East Lansing. Detroit Edison Company and Consumers Power Company also has literature available on garden lighting.

**Local Sailor In Exercise of SEATO Forces**

David M. McCarthy, aviation anti-submarine warfare technician second class, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. George D. McCarthy of 23133 Alder Ave., Farmington, participated recently with Helicopter Anti-Submarine Squadron Eight in a combined sea-assault and air-home combat training exercise called "LIGTAS," under the direction of the South-East Asia Treaty Organization (SEATO) in the Philippines.

"LIGTAS," meaning "Sared" or "Besueed" in the Philippine language, was sponsored by the United States and hosted by the Republic of the Philippines.

ALL MEMBER nations participated in the exercise which was part of a SEATO general counter-offensive to be used if an "enemy" should invade South-East Asia and gain control. The exercise tested the effectiveness of the SEATO forces to assault and regain control of areas behind the "enemy" advances.

The operation was designed to train allied forces in the planning and execution of this type of assault. Close working relationships and understanding among member nations was an important objective of this training.

"LIGTAS," the second training exercise this year and the 27th since 1956, was part of a long-term schedule announced by SEATO Headquarters in November 1963, to maintain joint military defense.
