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Michigan's Water Resources Safeguarded Under State Law

(Editor's note: This is a publication of the expected material, the service article explaining in general terms a provision of Michigan law, individuals who wish to determine the effect of any law upon their private legal affairs should consult a private attorney.)

Water is one of our most valuable resources. In Michigan we have nearly one-third of all the fresh surface water areas in the nation. However, we don't have enough to squander and our advantage in its abundance is worthy of careful preservation and enhancement.

Michigan law provides that it is unlawful to discharge into the waters of the State any substance which injures public health, the conduct of industrial enterprises or other lawful occupations; or, whereby fish, migratory bird-life or wild animal life may be destroyed or injuriously affected.

In addition, any person securing a new or substantial increased use of the waters of the State for sewage or waste disposal purposes must file a report with the Michigan Water Resources Commission setting forth the nature of the enterprise or development contemplated, the amount of water required to be used, its source, the proposed point of discharge of wastes into the waters of the State, the estimated amount to be discharged and a fair estimate of the cost of treatment.

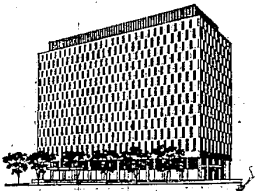
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
