

Local Dem Club Plans Bookshelf For Kennedy

Election of officers and plans for a living memorial to the late President John F. Kennedy will be the major items of business at the next meeting of the Farmington Democratic Club, scheduled for 8 p.m. Wednesday, Jan. 8.

The meeting will be held in the community room (entrance from the rear) of the City National Bank, Ten Mile Road at Orchard Lake.

Club chairman Harold Shpiece said that tentative plans call for the creation of a John F. Kennedy bookshelf at the Farmington Public Library. He said the books would be purchased by a special fund raised for this purpose.

THE KENNEDY books, which would be selected from the White House list of publications, would be placed in the regular library shelves for maximum use by area residents. Shpiece said the fund drive would be conducted on a community-wide and non-partisan basis.
