Break Ground for New Building For C'ville Methodist Church

The Clarenceville Methodist Church just finished a two-year building ground Sunday, June 28, the first unit of their new church building.

Bishop Marshall Russell, president, Bishop of the Michigan Area, officiated, assisted by Rev. Herbert F. Hauser, Detroit District Superintendent; Dr. Everett K. Seymour, pastor, First Methodist Church, Royal Oak, Michigan; The Rev. Elsie A. Johns, who begins her 24th year as Pastor of the Clarenceville Methodist Church, and many of the members of the church in official year.

THE FIRST building to be erected will be a \$275,000 educational unit, with a permanent hall and temporary worship facilities. The sanctuary and chapel will be added later. The Clarenceville Methodist

congregation of the Unit of West Suburbia Church, which for two years has been meeting in Livonia's Bentley High School, now have a church home of their own. Sunday, July 19, has been set for the formal dedication ceremonies in the new Unit of West Suburbia Center, 30025 Curtis Rd., Livonia.

This Sunday only, there will be a 9:45 a.m. service in addition to the regular one at 11:00 a.m., both to be conducted by Minister Diane Seaman. James Decker, noted lecturer and editor of Good Business Magazine, from Union Village, will be guest speaker at the two services. His talk is entitled "The Glory of This House."

The congregation and visitors are invited to attend the services and remain for the "open house" during the afternoon when they may look through the new buildings, walk through the grounds, and enjoy light refreshments. Evening services will be held at 8:00 p.m. and all are invited to attend the organist, Mildred Collins leading a "pulpit of song"; and Dick Hughes, former owner and founder of radio station WQRS-FM, in a "jubilee of religious verse."

The dedication date also marks the 75th anniversary of the world-wide Methodist movement which was founded by Charles and Myrtle Fillmore, Kansas City, Missouri, in 1883.

Michigan's oldest church building is the Old Mission Church on Mackinac Island, built in 1829 as part of a Protestant Indian mission. Although it has not been used regularly for church services, it is a popular attraction for all.

St. Anne's Catholic Church on Mackinac Island traces its origin back to the Jesuit mission at St. Ignace in 1600, while St. Anne's Church in Detroit, founded in 1704 at Cadillac, has been maintained as a parish continuously ever since.
