## To Seek Post Ruel McPherson Is Candidate On Twp. Board For Oakland County Sheriff

Martin E. Gluckstein of 32407 Chesterbrook in Farmington has announced he will seek the Democratic nomination for township trustee in the primaries on Sept. 1. Active in township affairs for the past 10 years, he has previously served on a special committee to investigate the effects incorporation would have on the Township. He also has served on the board of directors of the Farmington Township League of Subdivision Associations, the West Brooke Manor Association.

GLUCKSTEIN's decision to again run for the Township Board was motivated by what he describes as "a need to place on the Board independent, dedicated people to whom the public's welfare is primary and who are not afraid to stand solely for that end."

Gluckstein charged that "during my five years of attendance at Board meetings, I have seen the conduct of township affairs degenerate until sound and equitable processes have all but vanished. And the Board, a public body, has as its members a political science club tending to operate for the special interests of political cronies. I would hope, if I am nominated, that my opponents will have the sincerity of purpose to publically debate the issue prior to the Nov. 3 election. Perhaps some of the service, fraternal, women's, and religious societies in the Township would consider sponsoring such debates," he suggested.

DR. GLUCKSTEIN, a chemical engineer employed as a supervisor by Ely Company, is the father of five children, four of whom attend Isaac Bond Elementary School. Born in Brooklyn, New York, he was educated at the University of Michigan, receiving the Bachelor and Master of Science in Engineering and Doctor of Philosophy degrees. He is also a registered professional engineer and a member of several professional and honorary societies.

Gluckstein has expressed a willingness to discuss his can- didacy and platform with any and all who are interested. His phone number is GR. 4-2586.
