Alex L. Ramsay Awarded Degree From Northern Michigan U.

Northern Michigan University conferred degrees on 153 candidates at the largest graduating class from an NMU summer session at commencement exercises Friday, July 24, in Kay Auditorium on the NMU campus.

ALEX L. RAMSAY of 28273 Nine Mile Road in Farmington was awarded a degree, Bachelor of Music Education, at the summer commencement exercises.

Master of arts degrees were conferred on 78 candidates and 75 baccalaureate degrees were conferred. Sixty-five bachelor of science, eight bachelor of arts and two bachelor of music education degrees were awarded.

One hundred and twelve candidates also received state teaching certificates at the close of summer session.

Dr. Earl C. Kelley, distinguished professor of education at Wayne State University, Detroit, delivered the commencement address. His topic was "A Great Day to Be Alive." Dr. Kelley is an internationally known educator, author and lecturer. His most recent book, "In Defense of Youth," is used extensively in colleges and universities.

Antique Show Set Aug. 27 - 29


