James O'Neil Campaigns Here in U-S Senate Race

Invited to appear are candidates Billie S. Farnum, John Burke and Paul Rabaut for Congress; James McCarty, Joe Mullaney and A. E. Vellier for State Senate; and John I. Bain and Evelyn J. Labelle for State Representative.

EACH CANDIDATE will be asked to make a short presentation after which the floor will be thrown open for questions.

Candidates and other Democratic party workers will also seek names on petitions to preserve the present method of voting in Michigan. The petitions seek to set aside the so-called Massachusetts Ballot method, which is more difficult and allow only three minutes to cast votes for some 50 candidates.
