"Hector," the Turtle, at Zoo; Called Largest in Captivity

Jamie Kaler, eight-year-old son of Dr. and Mrs. James Kaler of 26029 Westmeath, Kimberley Subdivision, has presented the Detroit Zoo with the largest Painted Turtle in captivity in the entire United States.
The turtle, a sub-species of the Midwestern Painted Turtle known as a Northwestern, was caught by Jamie's father at Big Stone Bay in northwest Canada. Jamie, vacationing with his mother and father, spotted the turtle on a grassy bank as the family was out riding on Lake of the Woods. A devout admirer of turtles, Jamie pampered "Hector" throughout the 1,300 mile automobile trip back to Farmington.
UPON ARRIVING home, Jamie unhappily discovered his 18-inch friend to be much too large for the aquarium in his parents' home. Jamie's mother called the Detroit Zoo in quest of a good home for her oversized pet, and as a result was invited to bring the turtle to the zoo, for inspection.
Jamie and his parents were totally unprepared for the excitement Hector created among zoo officials, who pronounced him to be the largest specimen of Painted Turtle on record anywhere in the country. A professor who knows of such things proclaimed further that "he" is a "blue," and the turtle's name has accordingly been changed to Hectoreine.
Hectoreine now presides with distinction over the other Painted Turtles at the Detroit Zoo, who are 6 to 7 inches in length as compared to Hectoreine's carapace (shell) of 18 inches. Moreover, the turtle has been deemed a youngster, and therefore has an even greater size potential.
Jamie is proud that Hectoreine proved to be such a valuable asset to the Detroit Zoo and hopes his friends will make a point to visit her the next time they go to the zoo.

BPW Women at July Convention

Dorothy Sheffer, Lella Lambert, Marie Pappas, Gladys Mole and Audre Mahaney of Farmington were among the more than 4,000 members of the National Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs attending their Annual Convention in Detroit from July 19 through 21. The 17,000 member Federation is organized in 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.

Opening speaker at the Convention Sunday evening was a Senator Margaret Chase Smith, a past president of the Maine Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs. Senator Smith was introduced by a past National Federation President, Judge Sarah T. Hughes of Dallas, Texas.
Miss Virginia R. Allan, national president of the Federation, a native of Detroit and Executive Vice President of the Cahalan Drug Stores Inc., will preside at the five-day Convention. The agenda includes business meetings, workshops, training sessions, all aimed at the accomplishment of Federation objectives.

Final item of business on the agenda is the election of the national officers for 1964-65.
Emphasizing the Federation theme—"Responsibility of Full Partnership," outstanding leaders from across the country are scheduled to address the Convention. Speakers on the program include Mrs. Esther Peterson, Assistant Secretary of Labor and Special Assistant to the President for Consumer Affairs, and Mrs. Mary Keyserling, Director of the Women's Bureau, Department of Labor.
