## Emergency Medical Training Class to Open September 14

The City and Township of Farmington, in cooperation with the Oakland County Office of Civil Defense and Oakland County Health Department, announces a Medical Emergency Training, available to interested adults in this area, beginning Sept. 14, 8 p.m., Cloverdale School, 33000 Freedom Road.

The course will be held from 8-10 p.m. each Monday for 13 weeks and will include instruction and practice in the following subject areas: (Classes will not be held the week of Thanksgiving.)

**CASUALTY CARE System:** Basic Medical Disaster Plans; First Aid; Shock and Burns; Psychological First Aid; Emergency Birth or Disaster Born Baby; Radiation and Fallout; Decontamination, home, person; Medical and Nursing Aspects of Radiation Sickness; Hypertensive Technique; Use of Syringes; Blood Pressure Technique; Intravenous Techniques; Sanitation; Contagion or Isolation Techniques; Emergency Sanitation; Medical Aspects of the Shelter Program; and Field Exercise - Conversion of 1 school to Emergency Hospital.

Interested persons are asked to be at the class at 7:45 p.m.

The Medical Emergency Course prepares the individual for an medical emergency whether it be natural disaster (tornado-flood-explosion, etc.), an enemy borne disaster, accident, or family illness. The course trains the student to act intelligently in any home or community emergency or need as well as offering her (or him) an understanding of emergency hospital procedures.
