Effective Date of New St. Laws Depends on Your Legislature

(Editor's note: This is a public service article explaining in general terms a provision of Michigan law. Individuals who wish to determine the effect of any law upon their private legal affairs should consult a private attorney.)

When does a new law take effect? The answer to that question can have an important impact on many of your rights. The effective date of a new law depends upon the terms of the law. When the new law does not mention an effective date, the law does not go into effect until 90 days after the end of the legislative session at which it was passed.

Detroit Water. (Continued from Page 1-A) has troubles, Supervisor Hall cautioned.

The second area to get Detroit water, probably some two weeks from now is expected to be the Special Assessment District 13. This district is the area east of Orchard Lake Road as far east as Purdue St. and extending northward from Grand River Avenue to Ten Mile Road.

Confidence was expressed that all of the districts slated to be served from transmission lines coming up from the main line along Eight Mile Road should have Detroit water into them before the end of September.

THE ONLY areas where there is still a problem with regard to when Detroit water will be available are those which will be served by the Inkster Road running up Inker Road being put in by the Detroit Water Dept. which is presently being scheduled for construction.

If the delay looks like it is going to be substantial, the hope is that a temporary hookup can be made with a transmission line coming up from Eight Mile until the Inkster Road line is completed, according to Supervisor Hall.
