Family of 14 Left Homeless In Twp. Blaze

Farmington Township firemen responded quickly to a home blaze at 2883 Eldred Street near Middlebelt, last Saturday night when the one-story frame dwelling which had been the residence of a family of 14 was reduced to a total loss inside and an estimated \$2,500 damage done to the exterior.

Mr. and Mrs. Tracy Black and their 12 children, who had been living in the home, a garage which had been added onto, all escaped injury. The cause of the blaze was attributed to a short-circuited lamp socket.

CHIEF RAY GEARY of Farmington Township's No. 3 Fire Station, reported equipment was in service for about two hours at the fire. Assistant Chief Mory Fredrick said the blaze was never out of control but extensive damage was caused in the quick spreading of the fire.

Only four of the Black children, who range in age from nine months to 16 years of age, were at the home when the fire broke out about 9 p.m. on Saturday. All of the family's furniture and most of their possessions were lost in the fire.

The family is now staying at the homes of neighbors and contributions of clothing and other necessities can be left in care of Mrs. Lowell Palmer of 2809 Eldred, a neighbor of the Blacks.
