The Department of Public Works would like to take this opportunity to thank Plymouth residents for their patience during the rusty and no water period.

The contractor last week started cutting off and plugging all the old four-inch mains. However, workers found many of the old four-inch valves did not hold and they had to close down other valves until the water eventually was shut off. This meant many customers were without water.

The work should be completed this week. In the meantime, we hope all patrons will continue to be patient in this trying situation.

DPW crews were busy the past week flushing sanitary sewers and cleaning manholes. All city streets were cold patched. Due to the warm spell, some of the streets began to heave and tons of cold patch was needed. In addition, we had to use eight tons of salt to take care of icy streets.

A new catch basin was installed on York Street south of the railroad tracks. Work was done on Byron Street west of S. Harvey. Water taps were put in on Joy Street between Fairground and Virginia because of the cut off of an old four-inch main.

The mausoleum was cleaned and two funerals handled at Riverside Cemetery. The downtown area was cleaned and swept and refuse and papers were picked up in Kellogg Park.

A 15-inch storm sewer tap was installed on Plymouth Road for a new industry.

## Livonia PTAs Slate Action On Legislation

Legislation which may or may not be enacted during the forthcoming session of the State Legislature has the interest of many Livonians. The Michigan Congress of Parents and Teachers will conduct a statewide workshop on Saturday, January 16, at its headquarters building, 1011 N. Washington Street, Lansing, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. The agenda will include:

Consideration of potential legislation to be introduced in the coming legislative session.

Discussion of the working tools of legislation chairman and their use; and

Problems of communication from the State and to the State legislative committee and the response of the legislative chairman to other committees.

Jerrie Joyner, Legislative Chairman for the Livonia Council, reported that all local P.T.A.s have received a copy of the agenda, and a number of local persons will participate in the workshop.
