Madonna College Education Department and the Franklin Senior High School are planning a cooperative project which aims to analyze and improve classroom instruction by using videotapes.

Recently the Livonia Public School system installed closed circuit television equipment into the Franklin Senior High School. The use of the new medium will be extended to assist student teachers as well as regular teachers.

Teachers, staffing the school, and student teachers will be provided with opportunities to view their classroom in action. Such self-evaluation device will assist them to identify their own strengths and needs and to improve teaching-learning situations.

Novel or effective techniques of presenting content matter will also be taped so that other teachers can profit from the programs. These prepared videotapes will also be utilized as visuals during methods courses, seminars, and conferences.
