### Recall Visit Of Rubinoff

The news last week that David Rubinoff was being sued by the Wolverin's Hotel for remarks unfavorable to the establishment, recalls memories of the violinist's recent appearance in Farmington.

Rubinoff played two performances, under the auspices of the Farmington Kiwanis Club. Fritz Mueller, Lloyd Smith and others who spent the day with him caught the full range of one of the most volatile personalities in show business.

Rubinoff is a man of high ideals—probably one of the few top-notch musical artists who give free concerts for young people.

But there are other characteristics. He has a classical violinist's temperament. During his Farmington performances, a guard was placed at the door, so no one could come in after he got started.

He has an unshamed love of publicity and the spotlight. The Kiwanis took him to the Dutch Inn for a bite after the evening performance. Before sitting down, he announced loud enough for most everybody to hear: "I don't want any photographs."

Another thing about Rubinoff is his sense of humor. He is funny. Fritz Mueller was with him from morning to night. They got along famously. Rubinoff speaks with a pronounced Yiddish accent. He got started at 10:15, is equally German. At the end of their day, Rubinoff told him: "Fritz, if we're together much longer, I'll get up my with my accent. And I'll have yours."

Last week, Rubinoff charged the Wolverin Hotel with him for eight years—with forbidding him to practice. He said they turned off his heat and hot water for him last night. And he added some remarks about the Hotel's lack of cleanliness for good measure.

The hotel retaliated, by initiating a huge law suit against him.

There are already signs that the two sides are cooling off.
