Civil Defense Course Given

A course in civil defense is being given in the Farmington area, sponsored by the City and Township, in conjunction with the Oakland County Department of Health and Civil Defense.

Among the subjects that will be taken up will be: casualty care; basic medical disaster care; treatment of shock and burns; first aid; intravenous techniques; parental therapy and medication; emergency decontamination; biological and chemical warfare; hypothermic techniques; blood pressure technique; the handling of contagious diseases; nursing; home protection; sanitation; providing medical care in shelters and hospitalization in shelters.

Hearing Defects At Elementary

Two rooms at the new Larkshire Elementary School have been earmarked for children with hearing problems when the building is completed next September.

The Farmington Board of Education has agreed to operate with Oakland County on this special education project.

At present one room at Cloverdale Elementary School is used for preschool and kindergarten children with hearing problems. A few first graders have been added to this group.

A need has been felt for another room for early elementary children and Oakland County requested that two more rooms be in the same school.

A portion of the funds for the project will come from tax revenues.
