

Martin Luther Home to Open in April

During the middle of April the Martin Luther Memorial Home in South Lyon will open its doors to the aged.

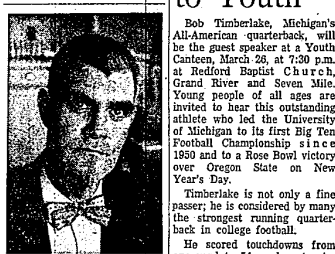
The project is the result of more than a year of hard work and planning by 41 Lutheran congregations in the Michigan District. Area Lutherans have been in the forefront of the project. Rev. Robert Mueller, Pastor of the Peace Lutheran Church in Livonia, is chairman of the Board of Directors for the Home.

Although the official dedication is not scheduled until May 16, the Home plans to open its doors to about 30 residents on April 15. Total capacity is 70.

Arrangements are made so that 20 convalescent cases and 50 ambulatory residents might be accommodated at a time. A staff of 35 is planned when the Home reaches capacity.

The building is located on a three-acre plot just about three blocks from the current business district in South Lyon. It was constructed at a cost of almost \$500,000. The furnishings have been provided by the various participating congregations and individuals.

Other area Lutherans beside Rev. Mueller who are on the Home's Board of Directors are: Emanuel Marion, Peace Lutheran Church in Livonia; Bernard Dittmar, St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Livonia; and Lawrence Blunk and Jake Brinks from St. Peter's Lutheran Church in Plymouth.

Physicist To Speak at Plymouth Church

W. C. Levengood, Associate Research Physicist with the University of Michigan Institute of Science and Technology will show a series of slides at St. Luke's Methodist Church in Plymouth on March 28 beginning at 6:30 p.m.

The topic of Mr. Levengood's presentation is "Aspects of Pollution and Evolution as Religious Problems." The public is invited to attend.

Mr. Levengood is the author of approximately 25 publications and articles in scientific journals concerning original research in the areas of Solid State Physics involving the atomic structure of glasses and crystalline materials and in biophysical research dealing with factors in the environment which influence reproduction responses.

He is currently engaged in investigation on biophysical experimentation on environmental factors influencing the fecundity of living organisms.

Saul Is Topic

The conversion and baptism of Saul of Tarsus, as told in the Acts of the Apostles, plays an important part in the Bible Lesson on "Reality" which will be heard at Christian Science churches Sunday.

23 YEARS OLD Memorial Church Observes Anniversary

Twenty-three years ago a small group met on March 17, 1942, in a store building in northwest Detroit to organize and form the Memorial Church of Christ.

From this meeting grew the present day congregation which is housed at Fenton and Schoolcraft in Redford Township.

When the first service was held in a school in early April of 1942 fifty-three people were present. Last Sunday, when the congregation observed the anniversary of its founding, 311 people attended the worship service and attendance at the Bible School number 311.

The congregation moved to its present building in February, 1960 when it outgrew its facilities located at Schoolcraft and Virgil. Actually the Fenton property had been purchased in July of 1955 when the congregation was forced to move into the Will Rogers School for additional space.

The building at Schoolcraft and Virgil was occupied in July, 1947—three years after the property was purchased.

Speaker at last Sunday's service was Lee Doty, the second minister of the Memorial congregation. Mr. Doty resigned from his post in 1953 to take up duties with the Great Lakes Bible College in Lansing. Today he is Dean of the College and its President. Pro-Tem.

A total of five ministers have served the congregation since Joel B. Hardigree organized the Church. The present minister Max Copeland joined the church in July, 1962.

During his term of service a total of 115 members have joined the congregation.

Total membership today is numbered at about 315.

The growth of Memorial reflects the growth of Redford Township and of the entire suburban area. It also reflects the dedication and hard work of the many people involved in the formation and growth of the church throughout the years.

Special music was provided at last Sunday's anniversary service by "The Anchormen," a male quartet from the Great Lakes Bible College.

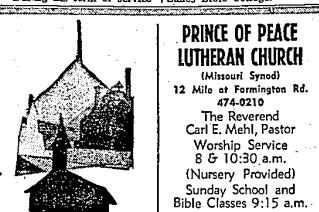
