

Edison Plans 5-Year Study of Growth Patterns in Area

The Detroit Edison Company is undertaking a five-year program of planning research to identify future growth patterns and potential in Detroit and throughout Southwestern Michigan. The company serves more than 4½ million people in Southeastern Michigan, and recognizes that the problems of its services area are interrelated with those of the growth of the city, the expansion of utility networks and residential neighborhoods and industrial plants.

In view of the magnitude of the problems and the great need for guided growth, Edison, in cooperation with Wayne State University, has retained the services of Doxladis Associates, Inc., of Washington D.C., and the Athens Technological Institute.

Dr. Constantinos Doxladis has achieved worldwide recognition as an engineer-architect-planner. His organization has directed major projects for the United Nations and individual countries in urban renewal, midtown redevelopment, community housing and comprehensive regional planning, including the design of new suburbs and cities.

The project, because of its nature, scope and objectives, is divided into three separate parts.

The first phase has been concerned with the collection of existing data and analysis of existing data. This phase began last November and is expected to be concluded by the end of this month.

The second phase will extend over the next nine months and from it will evolve methodical and procedural studies.

The third and final phase will involve the development of concepts and utility growth planning; it will commence in 1966 and be carried on through 1970.

The immediate objective of the Planning Inventory studies is to identify regional growth opportunities and problems, evaluate them, and make practical recommendations for their coordinated development.

Walker L. Claier, chairman of the board of Edison said, "The study is a scientific approach toward identifying, measuring and pinpointing the directions of pressures in this region which will cause urbanization to develop in certain patterns. These pressures are inevitable forces which are building in intensity as time goes on."

"This is a new concept or approach to the interpretation of regional problems and future growth," he said. "We hope that much of our work will be valuable to the Detroit Metropolitan Area Regional Planning Commission in its development of a land use plan. We, in turn, will rely heavily on studies carried out by Regional Plan, Detroit City Planning Commission and many other agencies in the region and state. We are most grateful for the enthusiastic cooperation we have already received."

Claier said, "We must all come to realize that our growth in the past bears no resemblance to the growth that we can expect in the future. For example, some studies show that, by the year 2000, the population of Southeastern Michigan will double to over 9 million people."

"Some experts even think that this prediction is conservative. In other words, we will add as many people in just 35 years as were added during over 200 years of Detroit development. Such development will truly bring about a completely different set of conditions."

Dr. Clarence B. Elliberry, president of Wayne State University, believes the university has a responsibility to act as a catalyst in this type of planning research.
