

McCullers' Play Set To Open at WSU

Opening Friday (April 2) at the Bonstelle Theatre is "The Member of the Wedding," Carson McCullers' prize-winning play about loneliness and man's needs to reach each other. The Wayne State University Theatre production will be presented April 2 and 3, and Thursday, Friday and Saturday, April 8 through 10 at 8:30, with a Sunday matinee April 11 at 2:30. The play was first presented on Broadway in 1950, playing a long run and winning the Critic's Circle Award as the best play of the year. It is the story of the growth of Frankie, an adolescent girl searching desperately for a "We." But all the characters, including her mother, frequent companions, Bernice and little John Henry, also seem separated and suspended, refusing to join the portrait of loneliness.

The Wayne cast features Linda Varrondo as Frankie, Bernice Avery as Bernice and David Merrill as John Henry. Also in the cast are Gail Rillo, Alleen Campbell, Connel Cargle, Jack Delo, Joan Glueckman, Joyce Klonner, Robert Reid, Richard O. White, and William R. Wilshire.

The production is directed and designed by Russell Smith, with costumes by Janice Snodgrass.

Test Wine at Mayflower

Eighty suburban gastronomes will gather together next Monday at the Mayflower Hotel in Plymouth for an epicurean evening replete with gourmet foods and bon vivant vitnages.

The banquet will mark the culmination of a series of gourmet foods and wine evenings which 40 suburban wives and husbands have been enjoying during the past two months.

The dinner, which will be a leisurely affair lasting 3 1/2 hours, will start at 7 p.m. in the Miles Standish room of the Mayflower with New York State champagne cocktails and hors d'oeuvres and canapés.

An advance review of the menu, which is still being architected by the chefs in the hotel kitchen, shows that the turtle soup will be followed by flaky Mountain brook trout, petite breast of poulet stuffed with cognac-marinated chicken livers, fillet of beef with oyster champignons, a special salad surprise and an original Mayflower dessert of scooped out honeycomb melon filled with out-of-season watermelon topped off with a special grape, inasmuch as the juices of grapes sets the mood for the entire affair.

Each course will feature an Italian, French, German, or American wine. To add to the leisurely pace, knowledgeable wine experts who specialize in the vineyards of the geographical areas represented will tell of the vintage being tasted and delineate the reasons why they are appreciated by wine connoisseurs throughout the world.

According to Stator Lorenz, the Mayflower foods manager and wine expert who has guided his suburban students through Bacchusville during the past weeks, the dinner, will be an "experience" and set a landmark for the 1965 gastronomical season.

Lorenz promises to select rare vintages from the hidden recesses of his personal wine cellar as a salute to his suburban guests who wish to learn more about wine lore, wine customs and wine eating habits.

The son of the Mayflower's owner, hotelkeeper Ralph Lorenz, Stator has studied foods and wines at Cornell University in the Finger Lake wine area of New York State. He is a member of exclusive gastronomical societies, some of which date back to the time of Napoleon.

The idea for holding a series of meetings to taste and discuss wines grew out of a gourmet course taught by Robert Wall, of Plymouth, last winter. The food-lovers, who came from many suburban areas, signed up for a Livonia evening school course which toured German, Chinese, and other nationally restaurants throughout the metropolitan areas.

After a semester of this, the adult students knowing that they needed a great deal more information about wines, asked Robert Wall and Paul Lutzeler, who became wine-knowledgeable while on a seven year overseas cultural assignment after the war, to set up a series of wine tasting talks covering the vineyards of Spain, Portugal, Germany, France, Italy, and the Ohio, New York, and California producing areas of the United States.

These talks, given by wine experts and students through the Mayflower Hotel in Plymouth, were held in Plymouth. Colored motion pictures of the Rhineland, the Finger Lakes, and other producing areas in Europe and the United States were also shown.

The banquet, set up as a "graduation exercise and final examination" for those who were involved in the wine tasting discussions, is limited to 80 persons. Other epicures, who may be left out, may be able to arrange an invitation out of Imkeper Lorenz. It's certainly worth a try, wouldn't you think?
