

DAV Slates Insurance Meeting

Disabled veterans, interested in securing additional information in regard to the recent changes in the National Service Life Insurance, are urged to attend a meeting sponsored by Chapter 113, Disabled American Veterans at the Memorial Home, 25644 Five Mile Road in Redford Township, on Tuesday, April 27 at 8 p.m.

Marvin Walker, DAV Field Service Officer for Wayne, Oakland and Macomb Counties, will explain the new law and answer all questions.

The law, signed by President Johnson recently, provided that disabled veterans can buy NSLI in a new form. Present holders of the insurance may change to modified life.

Eligible to buy NSLI are those who saw military service from Oct. 7, 1940 to Jan. 1, 1957.

Any veteran, who has disability which has been or can be found to be service connected by the Veterans Administration, and has no insurable non-service disabilities, is eligible.

Meeting to Eye Church Colleges

Sister Mary Raynolds, president of Madonna College in Livonia, will participate in a Conference on Church-Affiliated Higher Education Meeting, sponsored by the Danforth Foundation. The meeting will be held in Chicago, April 23, beginning at 9:30 a.m. and adjourning at 4 p.m. The Danforth Foundation has conducted a three-year study of church-affiliated higher education. This report will be the basis for the discussion at the conference. Each participant received a copy of the preliminary report and was asked to read it carefully in advance.

The purpose of the study is to make an assessment of the present position of the approximately 800 institutions associated with religious bodies and to suggest ways in which they can become stronger in the years ahead.

A series of conferences is being arranged throughout the United States to which representatives of the colleges in each region are invited; the expenses of the participants are to be borne by the Foundation.
