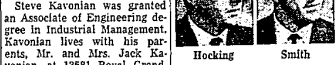
Eight Township Men Get Lawrence Degrees

Eight Redford Township men graduated last Sunday from Lawrence Institute of Technology.

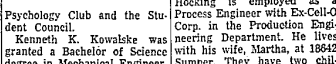

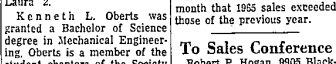

The bill would appropriate from the general fund the sum of \$50,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary for the Historical Commission to carry out this program for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1966.

"The marking of our historical sites is a distinctive tourist attraction, but for lack of funds it is now falling behind," said

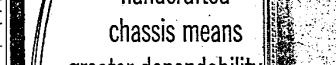
