BETTER VACATION PICTURES

You can bring better pictures back from this summer's vacation if you remember these simple tips about best picture-taking technique.

The natural look. Let your camera look of things as you do. Try to avoid posed group shots when you group people to say "cheese" while the shutter snaps, frequently makes for cheesy pictures. The more natural the activity, the better you'll like the picture result.

Tell a story. Your day at the beach starts long before you get your feet wet. Start shooting when the sun is peaking up and get the whole day: Arriving, Unloading, First drink for the water, Lunch, Afternoon activity, Sunset and return trip. You can make picture-stories of the little-league game, the backyard barbecue, or just watching the car.

Check the background. A cluttered background can distract from pictures of people. Whenever possible choose something plain. Grass, sky, deep trees or a plain wall.

Make sure the lens is clean. Fingerprint smudges on the lens can rob your best shots of that sparkling quality. Wipe gently with a soft tissue or lens cloth can remove most of them. Don't punch it. Sticking at the shutter release is the most frequent cause of blurred snapshots. Remember, easy does it. Press your shutter release gently.

ANN ARBOR—Water pollution, currently a controversial issue in Michigan and the nation, will be discussed at the 48th annual meeting of the University Press Club of Michigan Sept. 24-25.

Dr. Berkeley Smith, publisher of the Inoco County News, East Tawas, and club president, said U. S. Senator Philip A. Hart would speak at the opening luncheon Friday in the Michigan Union on the U-M campus.

Addressing a dinner meeting that night will be Dr. Leon W. Weinberger, chief, Basic and Applied Sciences Branch, Division of Water Supply and Pollution Control, U.S. Public Health Service.

Loring F. Oeming, executive secretary, Michigan Water Resources Commission, will moderate an afternoon panel. Participating will be: Jack A. Borcharak, professor of civil engineering; David C. Chandler, director, Great Lakes Research Division, Institute of Science and Technology, and zoology professor; and E. Crane, chairman, department of conservation, School of Natural Resources; and Clarence J. Velt, director, Michigan Department of Environmental Health, School of Public Health, all of the University.

A question-and-answer period, business meeting, and the California-Michigan football game make up the Saturday program.
