No Stand by Civic Groups on Tax Issue

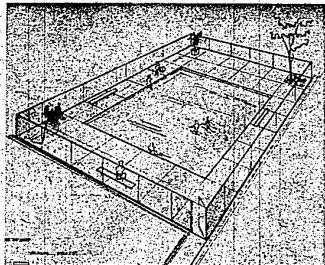
The Federation of Livonia Civic Associations took a hands-off position on the proposed local tax hike for police and fire salaries which will go on the Sept. 14 Livonia ballot. "I don't know of any of the 25 civic associations in the city," heard Mayor Harvey Moskley, City Council President. But the Federation of Livonia Civic Associations, Police Officers Ed Mulligan, and Councilman Ed Mulligan, expressed their views on the proposal at their August 10 meeting.

In other action the Federation 1) established a committee to study development of a reference book containing copies of all city ordinances pertaining to homes and neighborhood affairs for Civic Association guidance; 2) placed an outing to Frankmouth for Civic Association members; 3) discussed ways in which Civic Associations can assist the City's founding "Livonia The Beautiful" Committee.

Next scheduled meeting September 20, will be an election of officers. All Civic Association officers and interested Livonians are urged to attend.

City Buys Tractor From Broquet Sales

On the recommendation of City Manager John Dinan, the Farmington City Council has agreed to purchase a Ford International Tractor, from the Broquet Tractor and Sales Co. of Farmington, for \$4766. This was the second low bidder, in the City's search for a tractor and front end loader.

The lowest bidder, the International, which had a price tag of \$4430 was ruled against because, according to Dinan, it "failed to meet specifications on the size of the front end loader," and on "the lifting capacity and the number of ply on the rear tires."

The International is in use in Warren, where, says Dinan, it is regarded as "a good tractor" but one with "some shortcomings; slow in starting, and when the front end loader and the backhoe were in use at the same time you could not use the power-steering apparatus."

Of the Ford International, Dinan said: "The front End Loader is an integral part of the tractor and has a 1/2 cubic foot bucket compared to the 3/4 cubic foot bucket of the International. "It has a lifting capacity of 3750 lbs. compared to 3,000 lbs."

"The Ford has a new concept on engine with only three cylinders compared to the six cylinder International. The department thought that it would probably be easier to repair and maintain than the engine with a greater number of cylinders."

Dinan concluded that the Ford "has strong structural members and that it would be easier to transfer the existing Ford Backhoe to the new Ford Tractor than to the International Tractor."

Acting on a recommendation from City Manager John Dinan, the Farmington City Council has established a special assessment district for the concrete paving of Nine Mile Road, from Farmington Road east to the 106th ramp, as prepared by the Oakland County Road Commission.

According to the Road Commission, the project will cost approximately \$25,000, for what will be an 8" uniform concrete pavement, 20' wide, with necessary grading and drainage.

Fifty per cent of the cost will be picked up by the County. The City at large will pay 25 per cent. And the abutting property owners will pay 25 per cent.

The shutting property owners will then pay \$3 per linear foot. The possibility of paving this stretch of road with asphalt had previously been discussed. The approximate cost had been estimated at \$13,000. But the City Council decided that concrete was preferable because of its greater longevity and less need of maintenance.

While waiting, Lee allegedly brought out his wallet, took out a sum of money and handed it to the reporting officer in the police car.

Asked about the money, Lee reportedly told the officer it was to get a change in the accident report.

The office promptly placed Lee under arrest on the charge of attempting to bribe an officer.

Lansing Eyes Livonia School Bonds

The Livonia Public Schools \$15 million "construction, bond plan which was approved by district voters by a two-to-one majority is in the hands of the Municipal Finance Commission in Lansing for its approval.

If the proposal is approved in Lansing the bonds will be advertised for sale.

The bond package approved by the voters last June will be used in erecting, furnishing, and equipping three additional junior high schools, constructing additions to two existing junior high schools, building up, equipping 150 elementary classrooms, erecting storage facilities, modernizing older schools, securing sites for future schools, for purchasing books and equipment, for a structural addition to fields, developing and improving sites, and carrying on other needed construction.

The bonds will be paid off at annual maturity dates starting in 1968 and ending in May, 1992.

These coupon bonds will bear interest at a rate not exceeding five per cent annum. The tax-exempt bonds, usually purchased in large blocks by big bondholders; will be sold in \$5,000 denominations. Smaller investors sometimes purchase single bonds through investment houses and other outlets.
