

Sister Mary Danutha Gets Top Post

Madonna Board Names President, Academic Dean

Two changes in top administrative posts were announced Monday by Mother Mary Laurende and Board of Trustees of Madonna College.

Sister Mary Danutha was named president succeeding Sister Mary Raynelda,

who had held that position for five years, and Sister Mary Lauriana replaces Sister Mary Martina as academic dean.

The two changes are effective immediately. It was during the presidency of Sister Mary

Raynelda that the college made plans for and successfully completed a \$4.5 million expansion program that boosted the enrollment capacity from 400 to 1,000.

That work was finished last fall and students will be in all of the new academic buildings and the new dormitories this fall for the first time on a full scale.

Sister Danutha's education background includes a Bachelor's degree from Madonna College, a Master's from Fordham University and post graduate work at DePaul University, Purdue University and Carleton College.

As the head of the Biology department at Madonna, Sister Danutha

taught biology for the past 10 years, prior to her teaching at Madonna, she taught at several elementary and high schools staffed by the Felician Sisters.

Sister Mary Lauriana brings years of varied experience into her new office of academic dean. She received her Bachelor's degree from Madonna

College, Master's in education and Doctorate from Fordham University and did post-doctoral studies at Teachers' College at Columbia University. As associate professor at Madonna, Sister Mary Lauriana taught courses in education and directed student teachers. She has been the reading coordinator for the

archdiocese of Detroit for the past seven years, has directed reading workshops in eight different states, authored numerous articles in educational journals and edited reading and listening materials for grades 1-7 for the Archdiocese.

She taught in elementary and high schools for 15 years, Madonna College for

eight, at Fordham University for three summers and at the University of Scranton for one summer. Sisters Danutha and Lauriana will guide the 18-year-old Liberal Arts College for Women. The fully accredited college with its new modern buildings now has accommodations for 1,000 full daytime students.

He is a former instructor of mathematics at the University of Detroit night school; former editor-in-chief of the University of Detroit Law Journal; past president of the University of Detroit Law Alumni and is and has been for 15 years a member of the Board of Directors of the University of Detroit Law Alumni.

Foley is a member of Amvets Post 35, vice president of the Catholic Lawyers Society, president of the Archdiocesan Council of Catholic Men, and a member of the Detroit Metropolitan Airport Zoning Board of Appeals.



Explains Amendments In MESC Regulations

By Atty. Gen. Frank J. Kelley Recent amendments to the Michigan Employment Security Act will provide broader coverage and reduce the disqualification period in certain cases. Previously, when an individual was disqualified for one of the reasons set forth below, all of his credit weeks in his base period were cancelled (credit weeks are used to compute unemployment benefits and must be acquired within the 52 week period immediately preceding the filing of a claim—commonly called the base period).

(a) Where an individual left his work without good cause attributed to the employer.

(b) Where an individual was discharged with his work.

(c) Where an individual has failed without good cause to accept suitable work when offered to him, or to return to his customary self-employment, if any, when so directed by the local employment office or the Commission.

The amendments reduce the period of disqualification in those situations to six weeks. When, however, an individual has been discharged for an act of assault, theft, or sabotage, connected with his work, he may not receive benefits for a period of 12 weeks.

Prior to these recent amendments, an individual could only qualify for benefits by working for an employing unit that four or more workers in a calendar week in a calendar year.

When the amendments take effect, a claimant will be able to qualify for benefits by work-
