Demure South African Miss Guest of C'ville School Boss

The home of Clarenceville School Superintendent Louis Schmidt, at 20405 S. Ontario, Livonia, is a happy one these days. It has a new addition—a bright, charming young foreign exchange student from Hermann, South Africa. Her name is Geraldine van der Bijl, and she arrived on Aug. 10. The Schmidt family has already taken her on two camping trips: one to the Thumb and one to Interlochen.

On Sunday, Sept. 12, Mrs. Omar Mette, Chapter President of the Clarenceville Chapter of the American Field Service is holding a tea in her honor. It will be held at Mrs. Mette's home at 19890 Weyher, in Livonia between 2 p.m. and 3 p.m.

The South Africa which Miss van der Bijl described to the Observer is one much like this country. Controversial things were left for another conversation.

Her father, Hendrik van der Bijl died in 1948. He was National Director of War Supplies in World War II. He once worked for American Telephone and Telegraph in this country.

Her brother is a student at the University of Cape Town. Her sister Barbara was an exchange student in Crescent City, Calif.

Though she will be a senior at Clarenceville High, she is a college student at home. This is possible because our winters are South Africa's summers, and she is in Clarenceville on her vacation.

South Africa has no television. After seeing it for the first time at the Schmidt home, she feels she is missing nothing.

Our comic strips are popular in her country though and so are our folk singers Joan Baer, Harry Belafonte, and Peter, Paul and Mary for instance.

But essentially, she says, the culture of her country is attuned to Holland and England. She speaks with a lovely English accent herself.

She is especially interested in the theatre and in broadcast and many of her favorite stars are British—Peter Sellers, Rex Harrison, and Alex Guinness.

One of her major talents is not music though. Her roommate for the year, 17-year-old Betty Schmidt, on the other hand, is a talented musician.

She is a senior at Clarenceville High, a member of the high school band, and was a member of the chorus in the past year. She is a member of the Pep Club, which cheers on the Clarenceville football team.

Betty and Geraldine expect to have a happy year complementing each other's talents and interests.

State Fair Honors 2 Livonia Educators

Livonia School Supt. Benton Yates and Carl Bovee, who reside at 14405 Westmore Drive, Livonia, are among the outstanding educators and teachers in Michigan who will be honored at the annual Teachers' Day ceremonies at the Michigan State Fair on Friday and will extend through Labor Day, Sept. 6.

Teachers' Day traditionally is one of the highlights of the Fair which opened its 10-day run last Friday and will extend through Labor Day, Sept. 6.

Yates and Bovee were selected by the Michigan Education Association for honors at the annual program. Yates is a past president of the Michigan Association of School Administrators and Bovee is president of the Michigan Association of Elementary School Principals.

Awards for significant contributions to education will go to Dr. Lynn Bartlett, former Superintendent of Public Instruction; Dr. Clarence Zilber, who recently retired as President of Wayne State University; and Charles Stewart Mott, founder of Flint, famous philanthropist and civic leader.

In addition teachers from all sections of the state will be honored for their contributions to education. All educators will be admitted free to the Fairgrounds until 3 p.m. on Teachers' Day.

Dr. Bartlett, now assistant secretary of defense for education with headquarters in Washington D.C. was Michigan Superintendent of Public Instruction from 1957 to 1965 when the new state constitution abolished the elective office.

He now runs a world wide school system for dependents of military personnel stationed in 28 countries.

After receiving Bachelor's, Master's and Doctor's degrees from the University of Michigan Dr. Bartlett served as an administrator in the Grose Point school system. He was elected to the state post in 1957 and reelected in 1959, 1961 and 1963.

Dr. Zilber retired this year as president of Wayne State University and now is a special consultant to the Ford Foundation in New York.

He received his bachelor's and master's degrees from Oberlin College and took his doctorate at the University of Chicago. Dr. Zilber joined the Wayne faculty in 1930 was named chairman of the English Department in 1939 and dean of the department in 1945. He took over as president in 1952.

Mott, the famous Flint philanthropist and civic leader, made a fortune as a General Motors executive and has devoted much of his life to using that fortune to help the people of Michigan.

He established the Mott Foundation to support religious, educational, health, and recreational activities. Through it, he has given Flint millions for its community college, school system, hospitals and other civic endeavors. He has long encouraged the schools to serve the community as a whole.

The Teachers' Day ceremonies will be held for the first time this year in the new Community Arts Auditorium on the Fairgrounds.

Famed Hunter To Show Films At Green Motor

He has shot black, brown and polar bear, giant moose, caribou, dall sheep, mountain goat, deer and numerous small game animals and birds.

The color pictures taken by Dauksza are reported to be among the best filmed in that region and have attracted capacity crowds wherever presented.

The showing is open to the general public and all interested are urged to attend.
