Farmington AAUW Book Sale Set for September

Mrs. Robert Simanek of Farmington, fellowships chairman of the Farmington Branch of the American Association of University Women, has announced that the National Bank of Detroit had again offered its old bank building on the corner of Grand River and Farmington Road to the AAUW for its Used Book Sale, Sept. 23, 24 and 25.

For the 13th year, the sale will offer "good hunting" for readers and collectors. Old editions with their characteristic bindings will be mingled with current fiction, paperbacks, technical books, texts, and tales for children.

A White Elephant Corner will be featured with dishes, phonograph records, craft items and other good used materials. Proceeds from the Book Sale will benefit the Farmington Library and the Educational Foundation of the American Association of University Women.

This year fellowships were awarded to 96 women scholars from the United States and 31 other countries. The awards, amounting to approximately \$300,000, will finance research and advanced study, both here and abroad, during 1965-66 in the humanities and in the natural and physical sciences, including medicine.

Collection of books for the sale is underway. Mrs. Simanek says that contributions may be made by calling her (474-7832) for pickup, or books may be deposited in a box at the library. Books of any type, music and records are needed.
