**Report from LANSING**

RAYMOND L. BAKER

As tourism and recreation continues to boom in Michigan there has been an increased interest in Lansing for conservation matters in the recent past. The Legislature passed a number of bipartisan measures in the past few weeks.

Here's a rundown on some of the significant conservation bills passed so far this year:

- Authorized state and local government participation in federal matching programs for outdoor recreational facilities.
- Increased the budget of the State Conservation Department from \$11 million to \$13 million.
- Approved a bill giving the State Conservation Department authority to regulate and enforce fishing, hunting, and pier construction on inland lakes and streams.
- Reduced the fishing license fee for persons over 65 from \$2 to 50c.
- Designated the Petoskey State Park as Michigan's official state fish.
- Changed, for the benefit of weekend hunters, the regular deer season opener to the Saturday nearest November 15 in the Upper Peninsula and to the Saturday in November in the Lower Peninsula, which would fall on November 20 this year.
- Repealed Michigan's ancient bounty system on red foxes and bobcats. The bill approved by the Legislature, however, failed to win legislative approval. The bounty system
