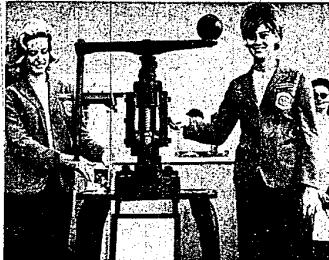
Candles, centerpieces for the table and house decorations also will be featured. All sale items will be on display and orders will be taken. Delivery will be three weeks before Christmas.

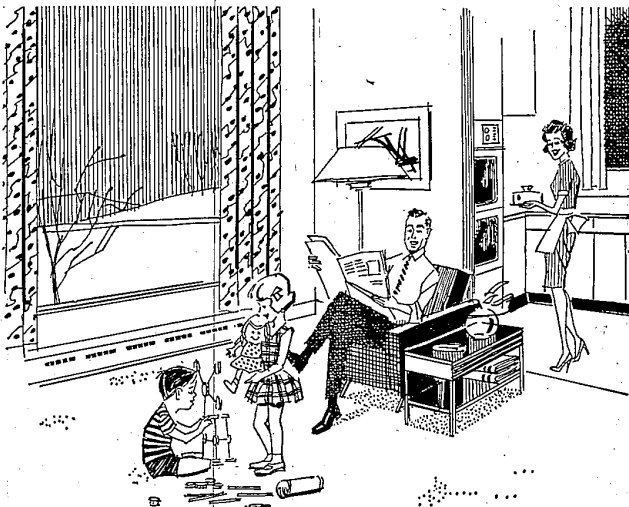
