Cornerstone Laying Set at St. Paul's

The cornerstone for the new main Sanctuary of St. Paul's United Presbyterian Church will be laid in special ceremonies at 12:30 p.m. Sept. 19.

Following the third worship service the congregation will gather at the southeast corner of the new Sanctuary for this important service. The ground was broken for the Sanctuary on Easter Sunday and work has been progressing steadily since then, with Freeman-Darling Construction Company of Detroit as the main contractor. James Morison of Detroit is the architect.

Taking part in the cornerstone service Sunday will be The Rev. W. F. Whitley, pastor of St. Paul's; Rev. Arnold S. Dabell and Rev. Thomas Estes, Associate pastors; Eugene Klimeck, chairman of the building committee and representatives from the contractor and architect.

R. U. Schools Going Into Red

Redford Union School District's revenue is up more than seven percent over last year, but it will cost more than 12 percent more to operate the schools than it did last session.

In other words, according to District estimates, the schools will close its books next June 30 with a \$241,468.95 deficit.

The Board of Education approved a \$8 million operational budget for the coming year at its regular meeting last Monday night.

Estimated revenue for the coming year is placed at \$5,803,330, as compared to last year's income of \$5,614,896. Of this a total of \$2,141,237 will come from tax revenues, while \$2,720,772 from the state and \$41,320 from the federal government.

The cost of operating the schools for the coming year is placed at \$6,044,789 by the Redford Union administration. Last year the actual costs of the District operation was \$5,376,244.73.

Of this a total of \$2,867,852.53 will be spent for elementary and secondary education. This includes salaries, instructional materials, and the costs of the special education, summer school and adult education programs.

Redford Union Superintendent of Schools Russell Wilbert told the Board that 9,014 students attended the Redford Union Schools last Monday. He cited the accuracy of the administration's prediction of 9,000 students in computing the expected state aid in this matter.

How much State Aid the District would receive was a point of discussion during the summer when the Board negotiated new contracts with the teachers. Both the Redford Union Education Association and the Redford Union Federation of Teachers contended that the administration's estimate of 9,000 students was too low and thus the District's projection on revenue from the state was off.

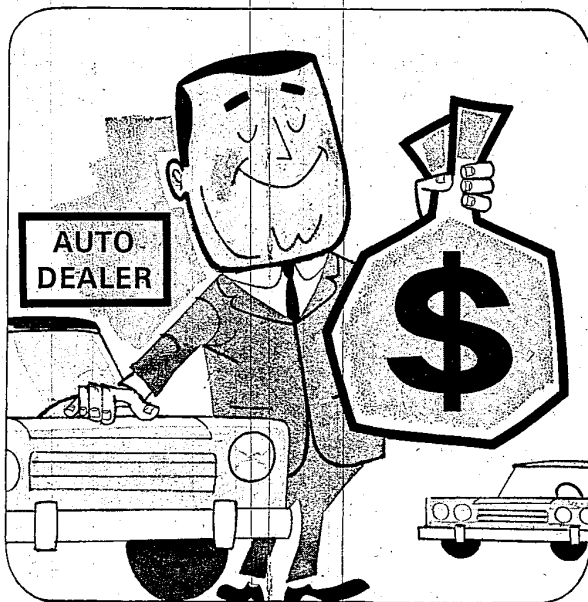
