New... New... and New; That's St. Agatha Story

New... new... new... So it goes at St. Agatha high school this fall when the subject of football arises.

To start with, St. Agatha has a new coach in John Trellay.

At least, Trellay is new to St. Agatha. He has had a long background in prep coaching and has guided several of the first-division teams in the Catholic League.

Next, Trellay is introducing a new offense to St. Agatha's charges. The team will use a Split T offense which varies from what Dave Brazil utilized in recent years in building St. Agatha into one of the leading "small" teams in the Catholic League.

Then, there's the fact that most of the St. Agatha players are new to the ways of varsity football. Many weren't on the varsity last fall, others who were didn't get much of a chance to play.

And speaking of the players, several will be playing new positions.

Finally, when it comes to "new," St. Agatha has been assigned to a different division in the Catholic League. No longer will the school have as its opponents Our Lady of Sorrows, Frontenac, St. Francis, and St. Michaels, Royal Oak, St. Mary's, etc.

"Another thing, Xavier has to be one of the divisional powers. If we could beat them, our kids would gain the confidence they desperately need in a hurry."

"I also feel that if we can get off on the right foot Sunday, we'll do okay the rest of the way."

St. Agatha enters the season with a top-flight quarterback, Mike Walzaniak.

"He's intelligent, a great student, throws hard and is well founded in the various details of football," says Trellay in talking about Walzaniak.

Dick Altshuler, Dennis McKenna and Ken Brauer will round out the St. Agatha backfield. Of the quartet, Altshuler is the only senior, which explains why Trellay calls his contingent "a new one."

Juniors Larry Rigney and John Menabhai will play the ends and be on the receiving end of most of Walzaniak's passes.

The tackle slots will be handled by Dan Pavlat, a veteran, and Don Gillis.

Pat Murphy, another stalwart, will work at guard,

LEMON TWIST: Detroit's T. D. Buhl's contender.

"If we suffer some bad lumps early—well, I don't want to think we will."

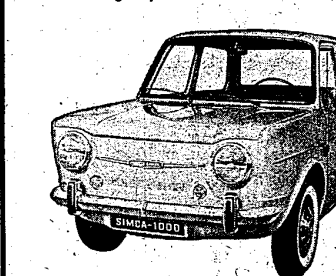
Farmington has its usual tough schedule ahead.
