

Eight Killed in Traffic Accidents in Area

Traffic took its heaviest toll in years with a total of eight deaths recorded in the area since early Thursday morning. The list included four in Livonia, one in Redford Township, and Canton Township and two in Nankin Township.

It was the most deaths of the year in Livonia in such a short period of time and boosted the 1965 total to eight dead in seven fatal accidents. This compares with 12 accidents and 13 killed during the same period a year ago.

However, the accidents continued to spiral at a record pace in Livonia with a total of 2,200 to date contrasted to 1,855 for the same number of days in 1964.

Young Reed, a sophomore at Franklin High, was killed in a head-on collision with a motorcycle on Saturday afternoon.

George Bushaw, 17, of 19447 Mansfield, Detroit, who was riding on the motorcycle directly behind Tim, suffered serious injuries.

Tim was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Walter Reed. Mrs. Reed is a teacher at Adams School in Livonia. Mr. Reed is a custodian at Roosevelt School.

The Jenkins youth died Sunday morning of injuries suffered in a spectacular accident Saturday night shortly before midnight in front of Livonia Fire Station No. 1 on Middlebelt Road near Plymouth.

Police are still investigating the cause.

First reports indicate that Jenkins was driving south on Middlebelt when his car, in some as yet unexplained manner, collided with that operated by Harold Hug, 23, of Mt. Clemens.

The Jenkins car spun to the right, skidded off the road, hit a utility pole, and flipped over a fence at the Ford plant.

Norby and his brother, Lenny, 21, were thrown clear of the convertible which landed on its top. Both were in critical condition when rushed to St. Mary Hospital and Norby succumbed to the injuries Sunday morning.

Lenny is still in the hospital where his condition is now regarded as good.

Meanwhile, the Hug car swerved to the left into the oncoming northbound traffic and crashed head-on with a vehicle operated by Samuel Miller, 26, of 2238 LaSalle, Detroit.

Miller was taken to St. Mary Hospital with severe head and body injuries. Hug was released from the hospital after examination.

Li. Robert Mitchell, head of the Livonia Police Traffic Bureau, indicated the investigation is continuing and that Hug will be questioned again along with Lenny Jenkins.

Corp. Richard Erickson, of the Traffic Bureau, who investigated the fatal crash, also is checking the statements of witnesses. Both Erickson and Mitchell hope to have a complete report before the end of the week.

Arbus and Pegram were victims of an unusual accident Thursday morning during a driving rain.

They were riding in a car driven by John Vennay, 32, of 14335 Braine, Detroit, alone, with two others enroute to work at the Western Electric plant in Plymouth.

Police reports show that Vennay was going towards Plymouth on Schoolcraft behind a slow car. He attempted to pull out to the right to pass on the two-lane highway but the car skidded, he lost control and it rammed a tree head-on.

Arbus, who was riding in the front seat, apparently was catapulted into the windshield and Pegram, in the center seat in the rear, was thrown forward with terrific force.

Both were pronounced dead on arrival at St. Mary Hospital. Vennay is reported in serious condition in the hospital. The other passengers, Ronald Thompson, of 15224 Stratton, and Marvin McDonald, of 14193

Westwood, both of Detroit, were less seriously injured but also were taken to the hospital.

Edith Warrick, was killed by a car while crossing

Schoolcraft at Riverview. She was hit by a westbound vehicle driven by John J. Maloney, 17, of Inkster. Maloney was not held.

Marza was pronounced dead on arrival at Wayne County General Hospital after he lost control of his car on Edward Hines Drive near Ann Arbor

Trail and collided head-on with a car driven by Clifford Bonnell, 35, of 3534 Cindy Road, Livonia. Bonnell was reported in serious condition in St. Mary Hospital.

The accident occurred Thursday morning during the driving rain that caused the accident on Schoolcraft.

Waterman was struck and killed by a car as he drove his bike at Van Born and Lilley Road.

Peyton died Saturday when a car, in which he was a passenger, went out of control on I-94 near Wayne Road in Nankin Township and rolled over, throwing him out, according to Sheriff's Road Patrol reports.

The purpose was to hear the report of the 287-man and woman Task Force reporting on their assignments in establishing a platform on party principles, programs and goals, fiscal reform, urban and local problems, civil rights, crime and delinquency, senior citizens, health, mental health, education, social welfare, labor, job opportunities, agriculture, natural resources and recreation, traffic safety, election laws, party organization.

Immediately following the convention the members of the Federation of the fighting 15th District passed a resolution opposing any State Income Tax based on a present surplus in the State Treasury.

Sgt. Paciorek Is Questioned By Piggins

Witnesses called last week to testify in the Wayne County ticket-fixing investigation included Sgt. Paul Paciorek, suspended road patrol officer, and sheriff's deputies Lewis Huddleston and his younger brother, James, both members of the "Big Five" who triggered the current one-man grand jury probe.

They were among the first to be called by Circuit Judge Edward S. Piggins began delving into the tangled web of detail which includes canceled tickets, said to number almost 5,000.

Another witness was Kathy Webb, 20, described as a "statuesque brute" who was formerly employed as a waitress at the Daly Drive-In, 1622 S. Wayne Road, Nankin.

Before the grand jury was approved the told members of the Wayne County Prosecutor's staff that, as a favor to customers, she would take their tickets and give them to friends on the Road Patrol who came to the restaurant.

Also implicated in the scandal is Paciorek's superior officer, Dan D. Martin, in charge of the road patrol, who was suspended at the same time as Paciorek by Wayne County Sheriff Peter L. Bubb.
