Sunday, Sept. 15, will be a big "Homecoming Day" for the Franklin Community Methodist Church, in Franklin, one of the oldest Methodist Churches in Michigan. After Labor Day things have a way of settling down into a routine. The kids return to school, business resumes its normal hectic pace, and the regular activities such as church attendance, bowling, and the bridge club resume.

Churches resume their regular schedule of worship. They also resume the Christian Education or religious instruction program.

Each Sunday morning, Sunday Schools and Church Schools hold classes. On Saturday mornings and during the week, the Catholic children who do not attend a parochial school attend Confraternity of Christian Doctrine classes.

A tremendous amount of time and effort is spent on these classes. They are also frustrating and rewarding experiences for the teachers and administrators.

Why? Why bother taking on such a thankless task as religious instruction for children who, very often, resent this intrusion on their leisure time?

One of the best answers to this was enunciated recently by James Schaefer, pastor of the Pilgrim Congregational Church in Livonia. In the church's publication "The Pilgrim Progress" he states:

"If the Christian faith were a matter of finding a religious feeling with one's emotions, there would be little need for education and nurture of either children or adults. But Christianity is a historical faith in the sense that it finds its roots in the lives of human beings inspired and directed by God."
