Slate 14 New Rooms at Hoover

Fourteen more classrooms will be added to the 11 room Hoover elementary school at Levan Road and Ladywood, according to Dominick A. Tadonilo, chairman of the Livonia School Board's building committee.

This school is in Section 17, west of Newburgh Road between Five and Six Mile Roads. This area has shown a 25 percent increase in new homes since last year.

James G. Otto, principal, told how 75 new students showed up during the opening week of school.

"Most of the new homes in this neighborhood have three or four bedrooms," Otto said, "as houses are completed, we can expect new surprises each week throughout the year."

"Last year we were pretty well surrounded by open woods. This year we have new homes across the road and six newly approved subdivisions in our area."

Tadonilo said that 75 extra youngsters requires 24 extra classrooms, plus more teachers, books, and other equipment.

Money for the fourteen-room addition was allocated from the \$15,000,000 bond issue passed by the Livonia district taxpayers earlier this year.
