

Drivers Begin Paying Into Accident Claims Fund Nov. 1

LANSING—The "44 question" in Michigan these days centers about the payment of \$1.00, the sum which all persons with liability insurance will have to pay into the state's new Motor Vehicle Accident Claims Fund when they begin registering cars and other motor vehicles November 1.

The question is usually about the same... "Why me? Why do I have to pay when I already carry liability insurance?"

The answer is simple, according to Secretary of State James M. Hare. "The dollar actually buys insurance protection."

Hare said the \$1 fee along with the \$25 from each uninsured vehicle owner will be used to finance the Fund from which innocent victims of accidents with uninsured drivers will be able to draw upon when the claims are filed starting January 1, 1966.

"The dollar, paid into the Fund actually protects the insured motorist against accidents with negligent, uninsured drivers."

"It protects against contingencies such as personal injury in accidents with hit-and-runners and persons driving stolen vehicles, and out-of-state uninsured drivers who are involved in Michigan accidents."

Hare cautioned against dropping the private uninsured protection rider, however.

"The Fund and the rider offered by private insurance companies complement one another," Hare said. "One covers any contingencies in Michigan, while the rider offers complete protection outside the state."

"With most persons traveling outside Michigan these days," Hare said, "my advice is to continue or buy the private option." There is legislation which would make such coverage mandatory.

Hare said one of the main intents of the Fund is to force as many uninsured motorists as possible into the insured category.

"Percentage is about 85 percent insured as near as we can presently calculate," says Hare. "Most funds of this type have resulted in about half of the uninsured getting into the insured class which would bring Michigan to more than 90 percent insured drivers."

"I'm hopeful of getting it even higher than that," Hare said.

He said he doubted that too many of the "high risk" drivers would buy insurance. "Actually, the \$25 they will be paying into the Fund is a small part of what they would pay for complete liability coverage. Being a realist, I doubt that many of these people will become insured."

"Persons who drive without liability coverage are taking a terrible risk," Hare said. "They are gambling with their future solvency... because a bad accident could mean that they would have to pay back into the Fund hundreds and perhaps thousands of dollars."

U-M Will Study Families in 350 Communities

ANN ARBOR — Families in 350 communities across the United States will be interviewed between Oct. 15 and Nov. 30 in the next national survey by The University of Michigan's Survey Research Center.

About 1500 interviews will provide an accurate picture of how the American people are getting along and how they feel about current topics. Changes in their economic situation, their views on prices and business conditions, savings, habits, the use which people make of banks will be among topics of interest in the study.

A national field-staff conducts the interviews. The Survey Research Center, a division of the Institute for Social Research, has been conducting such research for 19 years.
