What to Do If Power Goes Dead
Power failures can come at any time of the year, but they are most likely during bad weather.
Lines can be blown down by high winds and rain, can sag and snap under the weight of ice and snow.
Low temperatures make power lines brittle, more susceptible to breaking.
There are things you can do about the resulting discomfort and problems a power failure brings on, but nothing you can do about the failure itself.
Stay away from downed power wires. Notify the police of the location of downed wires and they'll set up barricades.
Indoors there is the problem of getting along without electricity.
This means no lights, no appliances, often no heat since automatic furnaces need electricity for controls and forced air systems require it for blowers.
If you have an electric stove you lack a means to cook.
An emergency supply of candles and several flashlights belong in every home.
Disconnect all appliances immediately—those that run continuously or electrically. These include refrigerators, freezers, furnace blowers and electric pumps.
Often power is restored at only partial voltage. Motors will work harder trying to make up for less power and will cause damage to windings and contacts.
Keep a lamp plugged in where you can see it easily.
When power is restored, observe the lamp. If it glows feebly, then you have only partial voltage.
Once the light starts glowing brightly you can start connecting appliances, one at a time. Even if power were restored at full voltage, it is wise to have appliances disconnected.
Everything going on at once could cause an overload if it were in your house is just barely adequate.
Avoid opening and closing refrigerators and freezers as often as possible.
If you keep the freezer closed its contents will keep for 36 to 48 hours. Food in a refrigerator will not last quite as long.
If you use electricity for cooking, then some emergency means of cooking should be provided.
Small camp stoves can be used to prepare hot food. Propane stoves are efficient.
Small, folding stoves using canned heat are less efficient, but are cheaper.
Use these in a well ventilated room. You also can use the portable gas grill you normally use in summer.
But do so in an open garage or open porch. Aside from smoke, the fumes from the charcoal can be dangerous in a confined area.
If you have a fireplace that's usable you have a source of heat until power is restored.
It's a source of heat, that is, if you have remembered to have a stock of dry wood handy.
Keep the family in the one room with the fireplace if your house is so equipped, or in the room in which you are cooking. Open and close outside doors as little as possible.
Try to use outside entrances that do not open directly into a room but into a hall or foyer that can be closed off.
Close off unused rooms and sit tight.

List Training Aid To Assist Plumbers
A special training aid is providing better plumbing service for you.
This training unit, developed by the Cast Iron Soil Pipe Institute, is designed for use in apprentice training schools to teach young apprentice plumbers the proven methods of joining cast iron soil pipe with a molten lead on oakum joint.
A series of state contests are held each year, with winners attending the one-week national competition at Purdue University.
The apprentices use a specially designed two-piece unit composed of one segment with an extra heavy hub on one end and a service weight hub on the other.
The second half of the unit is a short piece of pipe with an extra heavy head at one end and a service weight head at the other end. The two units are secured with special clamps which are joined.
The two hub pieces are made in such a way that they must be put together correctly. Once joined together, the apprentice inserts the corresponding weight of the spigot into the corresponding weight of the hub. He then begins to caulk the joint.
Oakum is used to caulk the lower joint, and is inserted to within an inch of the top.
One inch of caulking lead is then poured on top to complete the process.
Lead melts at a temperature of about 620 degrees F., but to complete a successful caulking operation, the lead is heated to a pouring temperature of 750 degrees to 830 degrees F. to insure the required fluidity for successful pouring.
The reason for the two-piece hub now becomes apparent.
