## BEECHVIEW

A senate hearing on special education will be conducted by a committee of five state senators Monday, November 15, at 8 p.m. in Beechview Elementary School, Farmington Township.

The special senate committee, which is meeting here at the invitation of Beechview's Parent-Teachers Association, was created last May to study the problems of multiple handicapped children in the state of Michigan.

Chairman of the special committee is State Senator Roger E. Craig, of Dearborn, and members include State Senators Edward J. Robinson, also of Dearborn; Jan B. Vanderploeg, of North Muskegon; Harold J. Vollema, of Holland; and Milton Zasman, of Grand Rapids.

Beechview P.T.A. President William J. Flattery said the hearings would include an introduction by Chairman Craig to the general problem of training and educating multiple handicapped children, a testimony by local area witness concerning a specific case, and a discussion by the committee of measures and facilities needed to handle such cases.

The senate hearing is the first of its kind to be held before a local P.T.A. group. The public is invited to attend.
