Garden City Presbyterians Place Building Cornerstone

The congregation of the Garden City Presbyterian Church assembled between services for the cornerstone laying of the new \$150,000 Christian education building Sunday.

Taking part in the service presided over by the pastor, the Rev. R. R. Rivera, were Mrs. Lillian Macfie and Mrs. Maclene Embling.

Mrs. Macfie is the granddaughter of an early immigrant from Ireland to this area and both she and her father were born in what is now Garden City.

She became a member of what is now the Garden City Presbyterian Church in 1912. Mrs. Embling was one of the early settlers in Garden City after the subdivision of the farm and became a member in 1925.

Steven McCallum of the architectural firm of Merritt, Cole and McCallum spoke to the audience while the copper box was being sealed for the cornerstone.

Assisting the pastor in the laying of the stone in place was Archie Cleland, superintendent of construction for the William F. Demake Company and John Fauer, a bricklayer.

Proceeds from the campaign in this area finance individual and group services given by the Easter Seal Society of Western Wayne County to crippled children and adults. These include year-round classes and clubs for teen-agers and adults; a summer Day Camp for crippled children; an equipment loan pool; purchase of special equipment for which no other resources are available; information, referral and consultation services.
