Madonna Slates Three One-Acts

"The Boor" by Chekhov, "Mr. Biggs" by Anna Marie Barlow, and "Dock Briet" are three one-act dramas in the current mood of whimsical or bitter satire to be presented at Madonna College on Saturday and Sunday, Dec. 4 and 5, at 8 p.m. in the college amphitheatre.

Lee O'Connell, head of the speech and drama department at Madonna, is both director and actor in the plays. The evening will mark the first appearance of the newly formed acting company, "The Trinitviate."

The three dramas fall into the tradition of black humor which started with the writings of Swift and Rabelais, went on through James Thurber to the modern novels of James Heller and others. The first of these dramas "The Boor" is a comedy about a recently bereaved widow, played by Ernestine Murzyk, who falls in love with a boorish Russian cossack, acted by Lee O'Connell; the servant in the play will be acted by Marilyn Sarma.

The one-act play is a penetrating, frightening study of two elderly sisters in New Orleans. It has a shocking surprise ending. The sisters Thibaux will be played by Madonna students, Joan Devertell and Rosemary Boonish, the young man in the drama is John Kinney.

The three plays will be performed with a minimum of scenery and props to allow the audience the full expansion of their imagination. This marks the second time male actors have shared the stage with Madonna girls; the first being the Shakespeare 400 Festival in 1964.
