- 1 dash garlic salt
- 2 teas. confectioners sugar
- 1/2 teas. dry onion flakes
- 2 teas. prepared mustard
- 1 dash Lawry's seasoned salt
- 1/2 c. sauterne wine

Then add:

- 3 1 lb. cans crab meat

Put into containers and freeze.

To Serve: Put in chafing dish to warm and serve with fancy crackers.

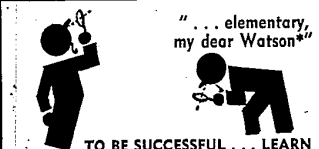
