Senate Unit Will Probe State Aid

The Special Senate Committee to study local, community and state functions and areas of state financial assistance to local communities, will hold a series of public hearings in the Metropolitan Detroit area.

The hearings are scheduled as follows: Jan. 6, Wyandotte City Hall; Jan. 7, Dearborn Heights City Hall; Jan. 11, Allen Park City Hall; Jan. 10, Romulus Township Hall.

The study is being made at the suggestion of Mayor Jerome Cavanagh of Detroit, who has been increasingly critical at the lack of state support for problems facing the suburban areas of the state.

State Senator Edward S. Robinson (Dearborn) said, "I hope this study will determine if there is any overlap between current, local and state services, and whether the state should increase its financial contribution to specific services demanded of local governments."

Members of the Committee in addition to Senator Robinson, who serves as Chairman, are Senators: Roger E. Craig (Dearborn), John E. McCauley (Dearborn), Farrell E. Roberts (Farmington).
