

Completes Combat Training

Marine Corporal Delbert W. Tebelman Jr., son of Mrs. Violet F. Burch of 22104 Cora in Farmington, a member of the 2nd Battalion, 5th Marine Regiment of the 1st Marine Division, recently completed advanced combat training with his battalion. The training was in preparation for his unit's transplacement overseas to the 3rd Marine Division on Okinawa.

Entire battalions in the transplacement system move as units from California to the Far East as part of a continuous training and replacement cycle. While in the Orient, the battalion will undergo mountain warfare and cold weather training in Japan, counter-insurgency warfare training on Okinawa and in the Republic of the Philippines and take part in amphibious operations throughout the Western Pacific.

AAUW Contributes \$500 Gift to Fellowship Fund

The Farmington Branch of the American Association of University Women has sent a check for \$500 to the Fellowship Fund for International Awards.

These awards are made to women of other countries to provide advanced training for women of outstanding ability who may be expected to give constructive leadership in their home countries upon their return.

This year (fellowships have been awarded by AAUW to 96 women scholars from the United States and 31 other countries. The awards amount to approximately \$300,000.

IN MAKING THE announcement, the Fellowships Chairman, Mrs. J. S. Ocker (22851 Woodbrook, Farmington), said the award this year was named for Gwendolyn Constable Gringer as a tribute to her interest in the Farmington Branch since its inception. Mrs. R.M. Gringer (28810 Halsted Road, Farmington), a charter member, is a past president of the Farmington Branch and has served on committees at the state level. She is a graduate of Hamline University in Minnesota. Besides being active in the American Association of University Women, Mrs. Gringer is a member of the Friends of the Library, Farmington Historical Society, and the League of Women Voters.

Michigan Bell Introducing New Phone

Michigan Bell Telephone Company customers will become the first in the nation to be offered a completely new kind of telephone on which the dial is part of the handset.

The new telephone, called Trimline, will become commercially available throughout Michigan Bell territory next Monday, August 2, and then will be introduced gradually across the nation, according to Frederick B. Hum, Michigan Bell vice president and general manager.

HUNT SAID The Trimline, designed to make use of the telephone handier than ever, is the result of eight years of research and testing by the Bell Telephone Laboratories.

Its dial-in-the-handset feature eliminates the need to reach for the base of the dial, and it makes it possible to have the phone located in places where a standard model instrument cannot be installed.

"The Trimline not only introduced a new look in phones, but a new relaxing way to call. It is an easy and comfortable set to use, and its modern sculptured look makes it as decorative as it is functional," Hunt said.

THE SET WILL BE offered on an optional basis at a monthly charge of \$1.

Another feature of the sleek Trimline set is its dial tone button. A press of the button brings back dial tone without need to reach over to the base to hang up before making another call.

In order to build the dial in the handset, Bell Laboratories developed a smaller disc that is easier to see and operate. It is smaller than the standard size dial because the space between the numeral "1" and the zero is eliminated. Finger holes on the Trimline dial remain the same size although its diameter is three-fourths inches smaller than the standard.

ON THE NEW DIAL, the letters have been made more readable by straight-line arrangement over the numbers instead of the familiar semi-circle shape.

When the telephone is in use, the dial face is brightly lighted by a bulb that is designed to last for years. Improvements in the moving parts of the dial make its turning smoother and faster. The volume of the set's bell can be turned up or down.

Chrysler Highlanders to Play

From the heather of Scotland to the highways of America, the skirl of bagpipes, ruffle of drums, and colorful flash of kilts have thrilled millions who have heard the music of a Scottish Highlander pipe band.

The famous band will march in the Farmington Founders' Days parade at 9:30 a.m. this Saturday, courtesy of Dameron Chrysler-Plymouth and Town and Country Dodge.

The 35-piece Chrysler Corporation Highlander Band, one of the top bagpipe groups in the country, has been taking this "bit of old Scotland" to cities and villages in all sections of the United States and Canada since it was organized by a handful of pipers in 1935.

Originally a touring band for Chrysler Corporation programs, the Highlanders today have earned a reputation of international acclaim, the year 1963 having marked the first time the Highlanders had entered the international piping competition since 1948.

THE "PIPES AND Drums of Chrysler Corporation," as they are officially billed, have given special performances for Queen Elizabeth and Prince Philip in Canada, as well as for government dignitaries all over the United States.

Almost 15 years ago radio and television appearances brought an audience estimated at a million and one-half in one five-day period.

In addition to command performances at state fairs, national radio shows and annual Caledonian Games, the Highlanders are known for their appearances in hospitals, homes for the underprivileged, and for special Armed Forces exhibitions.

HIGHLAND MUSIC is studied with tradition and historical references ranging from ancient Scottish tunes, such as the mid-sixteenth century "Bonnie Dundee," to "El Alamein," a rousing march composed by celebrated Field Marshal Montgomery's famous victory in World War II.

Cadet Witman Takes Command Army Training

The course of study is thorough. Coax training, training aids and live exercises and demonstrations will supplement the book learning.
