(Following is a copy of a letter written to the Oakland Co. Dept. of Public Works and also presented to the Township Board.)

Sec 36, Farmington Twp, Water Supply System, went into operation in the summer of 1941, on a Revenue B on d Issue. Mains and laterals, ap-proved by the Detroit City Water Board were installed. The Mains extended down Grand River, and across on Inkster Rd.

In the Forties our water pressure was inadequate. The Detroit City Water Board in-stalled a pumping station at Six Mile and Inkster, and since that date we have had all the pressure needed.

pressure needed. The dobt on Mains and Lat-erals was relited, and only in 1958 did we receive a debi-free water bill. The system built up a substantial reserve. Meters were poid for, all cosis defrayed, including help, office supplies and equipment, by the system.
